Services: Harvest Time International's Medical Care Center will provide medical attention for uninsured, working poor and low income families in Seminole and surrounding counties. Qualifying families will be seen by volunteer doctors and nurses in one of three available examination rooms. Basic medical care will be provided for uninsured individuals with an income below 200% of the federal poverty level. Our medical care approach also entails a focus on prevention and healthier lifestyle. Classes offered to clients include "affordable nutrition for low income families", "making right choices buying groceries", "fitness" and "healthy weight management". The goal is to prevent obesity and other diseases which most likely will be passed down from generation to generation through the example of an unhealthy lifestyle of the parents.

Provide short-term recuperative care and support services for homeless adults in need of temporary housing in order to recover from an acute medical illness or injury. Referrals are made from hospitals and emergency rooms that need a place they may discharge patients for completion of medical recovery. Pathways is not a medical clinic nor medical facility. Opened on July 1, 2003 as a licensed assisted living facility, Pathways to Care's overall goal is to support our residents to achieve greater health, self-sufficiency and housing stability. Clients are urged to develop and complete a social recovery plan devised to solve the root causes of their illness, homelessness, and joblessness. As such, PTC goals are far-reaching on an individual as well as on a community level.

Services: Shepherd's Hope is a health care center sponsored by St. Luke's Lutheran Church that offers free medical care to eligible members of the community. Shepherd's Hope provides the kind of health care services you would expect to receive in a family practice setting. Examples of illnesses commonly treated are upper respiratory infections, skin disorders, gynecological concerns, and urinary tract infections. Shepherd's Hope is not designed to serve as a permanent primary medical home for patients. Our goal is to provide basic, acute, non-emergency medical care, including some diagnostic testing for patients who do not have a regular source of care. Once patients have been treated, we help them find a permanent medical home, whenever possible. Shepherd's Hope does NOT handle emergencies. Patients with medical emergencies should go to the nearest hospital emergency room. Shepherd's Hope does NOT provide obstetrical care or well baby care, such as child immunizations. Shepherd's Hope does NOT handle Workman's Compensation cases.
